After moving to the U.S. in the 1930s, the British-born designer T. H. Robsjohn Gibbings, whose distinctive style combined deco luxury with the austere refinement of Classical Greek and Roman design, was immediately sought after by high society.

He opened a shop on Madison Avenue in 1936 and continued to design bespoke pieces of furniture for private clients. In the late 1940s he was commissioned by furniture maker Widdicomb to make a line of high-end pieces that could, nonetheless, be reproduced for a broader audience. Robsjohn Gibbings designed this suite as part of that commission.

The table can be extended with one 20" leaf. It is in excellent condition, with a caramel patina. The chairs have been recently reupholstered in a dove gray velvet. Chairs are 21" wide x 22" deep x 34 1/2" high, with a seat height of 18".
